



Epilepsy. Short Overview

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 English, abstract: According to census estimates, one in 103 of
 the UK population have epilepsy and it is usually misdiagnosed
 in 20 31% of cases. Sisodiya & Sander (2004) suggest that with
 an optimal treatment routine 70% of the population could
 become seizure free. However, the reality is less encouraging
 since Moran et al (2004) found that only 52% of people with
 epilepsy were living without seizures. This reflection considers
 my experience in caring for a service user with learning
 disability (LD) and suffers from epilepsy. Furthermore, it will
 focus on the bio-medical aspects of epilepsy and how it has
 affected my service user and the treatment available. In
 addition, it will explore the meaning of quality of life and the
 psychological factors experienced by the service user in their
